The purposes of the charity are to:

- 1) Raise awareness of dementia and its effects
- 2) Raise money to support people impacted by dementia (patients, families and carers) and to fund research

Trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit and remain satisfied that the purposes of the charity, and the way they have been undertaken, deliver public benefit.

The main activities undertaken during the year have been a series of fundraising challenges and events. The progress of these challenges has been communicated through regular newsletters and a website (www.rememberingnottoforget.org.uk) that have also profiled information about dementia in order to raise awareness of the issues for which funding is being sought. Trustees have also blogged to share their experiences of dementia to further raise awareness and create connections with others. Social media has been used to share these communications more widely.

The trustees would like to extend their thanks to everyone who took part in a challenge, joined an event or donated their money or time, including Dan Stone Accountancy for performing the independent examination of these accounts pro bono (donated services to the value of £500 have been recognised in the accounts).

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

During the period of these accounts, Remembering Not to Forget trustees completed 10 challenges/events in 10 months with the target of raising £10,000 by 31 October 2014. In fact £12,502 (before gift aid) was raised by 31 October! The challenges/events completed were:

December - Tube Challenge

January – Swishing

February – Cold Swims (10 of them!)

March – Quiz

April – London to Paris cycle ride

May – 45 mile walk around Ten Tors on Dartmoor in 48 hours

June – Henley Classic 2.1km river swim and 5km Colour Run

July – Family Fun day

August – Mount Kilimanjaro climb and Coast to Coast walk (Hadrian's Wall) and cycle (100 miles across Devon in one day)

August – World record attempt: high 5s in a vertical wind tunnel in one minute

September – Bodium Triathlon

In addition, we had the amazing support of other crazy friends who joined in the fun.

In March, Heidi Lynes ran The Reading Half marathon and raised £135.

In May, Simon Grace cycled 300+ miles over 3 days in the Tour of Wessex and raised £300.

In September, Eileen Clark raised £70 by running a competition to guess the weight of a pumpkin.

We were also very touched to be selected as the charity recipient at the funeral of the grandmother of one of our trustees, receiving a total of £350.

And then to keep things going after the trustee team finished their challenges, Phil Crisp raised over £2,000 by undergoing a full body wax...the actual waxing took place on 3 January, but much of the money came in from kind supporters before 31 December.

In total we raised an amazing £17,218 (including gift aid and donated services) in the period to 31 December 2014. The trustees would like to extend their thanks to everyone who took part in a challenge, joined an event or donated through the year. An amazing result for year one.

Donated services and facilities

Volunteer help

The value of any voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual report.

Investment income

This is included in the accounts when receivable.

Investment gains and losses This includes any gain or loss on the sale of investments and any gain or loss resulting from revaluing investments to market value at the end of the year.

EXPENDITURE AND LIABILITIES

Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources.

Grants with performance conditions

If there is insufficient room here, please add a separate sheet. In Remembering Not to Forget's inaugural year, the team set out to complete 10 challenges in 10 months to raise £10,000. The 10 months ended on 31 October 2014, on which date fundraising income stood at £12,502. As communicated to supporters, this was allocated to pre-selected organisations in the following proportions: Alzheimer's Society 30% Brace 30% Reminiscence Learning 10% Dementia UK 5% Alzheimer's Research 5% Playlist for life 5% Local 15% The national organistations were notified of their awards prior to 31 December 2014. Of the local allocation only £469 to the Memory Café Taunton had been awarded by 31 December 2014. Discussions were ongoing with the other local organisations to whom funding will be distributed during 2015. Income from November and December, including gift aid thereon, will be granted in 2015 together with future fundraising totals. Gift aid income has been put towards the costs of fundraising, covering in full the £1,650 contribution to the Mount Kilimanjaro challenge.
